


East Orange, New Jersey, nicknamed "The Crossroads of New Jersey," is conveniently located at the intersection of the Garden State Parkway and Interstate 280, just several miles from Newark Liberty International Airport and less than 30 minutes from New York City.

With approximately 65,000 residents, the 3.9 square miles of East Orange are adjacent to the municipalities of Orange, West Orange, South Orange, Montclair, Glen Ridge, Bloomfield and Newark. Originally founded as a township in 1863, East Orange became incorporated as a city on January 1, 1909. By the close of the 19th century, East Orange was an agriculturally-rich area populated by oil tycoons and Newark industrialists. After World War II, East Orange became a growing destination for the migration of black middle class from the South, as well as southern parts of the state.

Known for its spacious homes and wide tree-lined streets, East Orange experienced a huge population surge between 1940-1950, paving the way for the addition of luxury high-rise buildings and a boom of commercial businesses along Main Street and Central Avenue. Once called the "Fifth Avenue of New Jersey," Central Avenue attracted shoppers from around the region. In 1945, East Orange was ranked the 20th best place to live in the country among cities of a similar size and named the "Cleanest City in America" three times in the 1960s.

Transportation continues to be one of East Orange's greatest assets. At the peak of its industrial growth, East Orange had three train lines, three trolley lines and six stations. Today, the city is designated as a Transit Village and its Brick Church and East Orange Train Stations offer daily direct service to midtown Manhattan.

Currently home to a diverse cultural mecca of people representing countries from around the globe, East Orange combines the best of urban and suburban living. Spacious and affordable housing, a low crime rate, main commercial corridors, distinctive Caribbean and Southern cuisine, transit access and historic green spaces make East Orange a quintessential city for urban renewal.





East Orange City government is divided into three branches: The **Executive Branch** under the supervision of the Mayor; the Legislative Branch comprised of the City Council and the Municipal Court which serves as the **Judicial Branch**.

The Mayor and City Council are elected to serve a four-year term. The 10-member Council consists of two representatives from each of the City's five geographic wards. Five members are elected to the City Council every odd year from each ward.

The Mayor is the City's Chief Executive Officer, responsible for the enforcement of City ordinances, the preparation and submission of the City's annual operating budget to the Council and the appointment and supervision of City Department Directors. The Mayor may also recommend legislation to the Council deemed in the best interest of the community. Each year, the Mayor reports to the City Council on the previous year's municipal operations.

The City Council is the local legislative body responsible for appropriating funds and enacting ordinances and resolutions governing the City. The City Council reviews and approves the Mayor's appropriations and annual budget. The Council reviews and approves the Mayor's appointments to City Departments and several Citizen Advisory Boards and Commissions.

Each New Year's Day, the City Council meets to organize for the year. It adopts its rules and selects one of its members to act as Chairperson during the year-long legislative session. The Chair appoints each Council Member to oversee a standing committee. These standing committees serve as Council liaisons to City departments, public agencies, civic groups and public service organizations.

The City Council Chairperson serves as an ex-officio member of every committee and is liaison to the Mayor, Essex County Commissioner Board, the NJ State Legislature, the United States Congress and the East Orange Parking Authority.

Public meetings are held bi-monthly in City Council Chambers located at 44 City Hall Plaza, East Orange, NJ. To contact your City Council Member, call the Council Office at (973) 266-5120.

Snow Removal


IREDDING/SNOW REMOVA

During snow emergencies, all emergency parking rules are in effect. Motorists should adhere to all NO PARKING signs on county and city roads. Overnight parking rules will be strictly enforced.

The Department of Public Works will begin plowing when snow depths reach two inches and freezing temperatures indicate no melting. Residents are asked to NOT shovel snow into the street. Residents and business owners are encouraged to remove snow from fire hydrants located in front of their residences or businesses.

The only way to avoid additional snow removal is to wait until DPW workers have completed their final clean-up of your road. Essex County Public Works has designated workers to ensure that all county roadways are accessible for vehicular and pedestrian traffic:

The **East Orange Golf Course** is an 18hole regulation golf course complimented by a full driving range located at 440 Parsonage Hill Road in Short Hills, NJ.

The course was designed in 1926 by famed golf architect Tom Bendelow.

Our affordable, daily fee course was fully restored in 2017 by noted golf course architect Stephen Kay and includes a new 6,000 square foot clubhouse and Par 440 Restaurant Lounge, which houses one of the top sports bars in the area.

According to Kay, the goal of the renovation was to restore the oldfashioned charm of the golf course and make it appealing to players of all abilities.

Season Passes for the East Orange Golf Course range from \$500 for juniors to \$1,500 for individual unlimited. Senior unlimited season passes are \$1,000 and individual weekday season passes are \$1,200. East Orange residents and employees receive a 25% discount on season passes, or a flat daily fee rate of just \$18 for weekdays and \$20 for weekends.

Our officers use technology-led policing, community outreach and mentorship to build mutual respect and cooperation among citizens of a ages. Since 2018, the City of East Orange recorded its highest decrease in crime since 1967, with crime down 83%. To date, this trend has continued with overall crime down an additional 10%, with solution proven results. The EOPD has also updated its departmental policy regarding use of force, which provides guidelines and training for deescalating volatile situations before they get out of control. As a result of our commitment to keeping the peace, our EOPD is setting a gold standard for the lowest level of police misconduct investigations in the state.

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Daily, Visitor and Medical Overnight Street Parking Permits are sold by the City of East Orange Licensing Department. Residential, Senior, Disabled Overnight Street Parking Permits and Lot Parking Permits are sold online only by the East Orange Parking Authority.

COST FOR OVERNIGHT LOT PARKING PERMIT \$55 per month per car

- Parking lot permits shall only be used by the original applicant and shall not be loaned to, transferred to, used by or sent in care of another individual.
- Lot permits are sold online only at <u>www.eastorangeparkingauthority.com</u>. Lot permit parking is from 8pm to 8am in specified lots and permits may be purchased for more than one month at a time.
- Illegally parked vehicles may be ticketed and or towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Call EOPD 973-266-5000 if you think your vehicle may have been towed from one of our lots.
- Parking lot permits are not prorated and are only valid for the month it is purchased.
- Permit holders wishing to list a replacement vehicle for lot permit use must contact the East Orange Parking Authority to provide the information for the replacement vehicle and send email requesting change, along with new plate and lot name, to <u>eopapermits@verizon.net</u> prior to parking the vehicle in the lot.
- A parking lot permit is valid only in the lot for which it is specifically designated.
- Parking lot permits are valid only for vehicles properly registered with the Authority.
- Permit holders must report any changes of address, vehicle registration, and license plate number to the East Orange Parking Authority to avoid being towed, incurring violations and jeopardizing lot permit parking privileges, and shall cooperate with the Parking Authority in keeping records up to date. Changes can be emailed to <u>eopapermits@verizon.net.</u>
- Lot permit holders may use parking permits in borrowed or rental vehicles for a maximum of two (2) weeks, provided that the temporary vehicle is registered with the East Orange Parking Authority in advance. Email request to <u>eopapermits@verizon.net.</u>

RESIDENTIAL, SENIOR AND DISABLED OVERNIGHT ON-STREET PARKING PERMITS \$150 annual fee per vehicle, dependent on the month purchasing. \$75 for Senior and Disabled permit, not prorated.

To purchase the above permits and view the permit price chart visit our website <u>www.eastorangeparkingauthority.org</u>, and click on overnight street parking. The permit price chart is located at the bottom of the special notice page.

Permits to park overnight on City of East Orange streets on a daily basis are issued only by the City of East Orange's Tax Collection and Licensing Office at **(973)266-5130.** Overnight street parking permits are only valid on authorized streets and are not valid on street with signs that read NO PARKING 2AM-6AM ANY DAY. Alternative side parking rules must be adhered to.

Applicants must provide the following valid forms of identification as proof of residency: New Jersey driver's license, New Jersey motor vehicle registration and automobile insurance. A vehicle that is registered to a college student that resides in East Orange may obtain a parking permit at no cost by providing a copy of the student's current transcript and college identification.

The City of East Orange has three rate tiers based on water usage. Each tier has a unique water and sewer rate. If your usage is 0—10 ccf, you are in Tier 1 and you will receive a minimum bill of \$76.70.

If your total usage is between 11-15 ccf, your bill is calculated using Tier 1 and Tier 2. Example: Quarterly usage is 14 ccf: Tier 1: 0-10 ccf = \$7.67 * 10ccf = \$76.70

Tier 2: 11-15 ccf = \$8.11 * 4ccf = \$32.44

Total Bill Amount = \$109.14

If your usage is over 16 ccf, your bill is calculated using all 3 tiers. Example: Quarterly usage is 20 ccf:

Tier 1: 0-10 ccf = \$7.67 * 10ccf = \$76.70 Tier 2: 11-15 ccf = \$8.11 * 5ccf = \$40.55

Tier 3: 16+ ccf = \$8.91 * 4ccf = \$35.64




